Plenty on show at German ST and TT exhibition

ATARI THRIVING AT CONTINENTAL SHOW

Boasting 200 exhibitors, Dusseldorf's Atari-Fair '90 acted as showcase to the new ST-compatible 32MHz TT — the low cost workstation offered at only the kind of price it seems Atari can manage.

For £2,300 or so you can buy the entry-level 68030 4Mb TT which one day, the company hopes, will mature from the ultimate ST upgrade to something approaching a de facto standard. Although not yet supporting its planned Unix version 5.4 operating system, the TT was shown running Non Standard Logic's exciting NeXT-style front-end Wish2 — a 'X-Window Iconic Unix Shell' — which will be bundled with the 8Mb Unix TTs next spring.

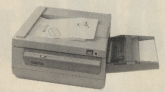
NEW TOS

Perhaps of more immediate interest to ST owners were the new versions of TOS and Desktop running on the TT. Although TOS version 3.0.1 is designed to run on 030 machines only, Atari plans to migrate it down to other STs as soon as possible. Described by Atari's vice president of technical development, Leonard Tramiel, as "a major development in the functionality of graphic interfaces", Version 3 and its accompanying Desktop set out to address a range of design enhancements arising from the GEM interface developed by Digital Research five years ago.

Menu options are now accompanied by keystroke macros, all icons are user definable in two colours, files and folders can be left on the desktop and most significantly of all, a shell or 'file mask' is now included which allows multiple file selection across a range of folders.

Atari also took the opportunity to launch a brand new budget-priced laser — the SLM605 — a compact, 300 dots per inch, six pages per minute printer expected to be on sale here for around £800.

Looking virtually the same as the current SLM 804, the 41 x 39 x 21cm laser should be out by Christmas, but judging by the appearance on another stand of Calamus SL, it would seem Atari may have a market for a colour laser too.

COLOR CALAMUS

The new Calamus handles full colour images in a variety of graphics formats and four colour separations suitable for professional DTP output are possible.

Priced at £400-£500, the package may sound expensive but since colour separation is only just coming to the DTP machine par excellence — the Mac — and is otherwise available only at a price well into four figures, Calamus SL, available here in December from distributor Signa on 0252 341600) would appear to be a real bargain.

Indeed, the new Calamus was indicative of the way the ST is viewed in Germany as a professional platform. Of the 200 exhibitors, less than half a dozen were games-oriented.

SERIOUS STUFF

Stand after stand displayed graphics boards, accelerator cards, DTP packages and sophisticated MIDI setups.

For instance, The Maxon board, from Macsoft on 01049 61196 481811, can boost the power of a standard ST by 360 per cent with its on-board 68020 chip, while the £900 Samplyer from KWS on 01049 221 327096 is a 12bit sampler offering stereo input/output at rates of up to 44kHz with a 30track sample sequencer built in.

Retouche Professional from 3K Computer Bild, but handled in this country by Copycare on 081 679 7307, also raised a few eyebrows. It's a 256-grey-scale desktop reprographics package offering photo-realistic retouching and halftone imaging. What's more it can read in Mac, PC and Amiga image formats — all for around £150.

Top of the range though was easily CSS's Gigafire — a Sony based 650Mb rewritable optical disk using 5.25-inch disks that's yours for £4,000.

With access times at less than 90ms, the Gigafire can be addressed as just another hard drive but with disks costing £280 each you'll be pleased to know you'll probably only ever need to buy one. ■

Portfolio equals portability

Atari's premier palmtop also made an equally impressive appearance. Now billed as a mobile office, the Portfolio was surrounded by new peripherals extending its usefulness as a lightweight laptop.

On the software side, the company showed seven new titles — among them Car Office, a journey logger ideal for someone on the move; Profit, a tax calculation suite; Time Manager, an appointments and scheduling package and BTX-VTX Manager, a videotext communication emulator. Hardware-wise, Atari will have been pleased to see several third parties beginning to deliver card drives (right) and PC connectivity for the machine. Indeed, one German firm showed off a unit for the Portfolio which housed a 3.5-inch disk drive, extra RAM, serial and parallel ports and was claimed to run any PC application. ■



Oo-Err Missus

While Express doesn't necessarily go overboard on all this New Age 'brain machine' guff, the surprise of the show was undoubtedly MindMachine's ST-based Megabrain.

Costing a mere £400, the unit, replete with LED 'eyespoons', purports to synchronise the left and right hemispheres of the brain and thereby induce 'whole brain learning' capabilities.

Amiga Screen Gems hits the streets

Amiga buyers are being offered a special package for this winter described by Commodore as "our best bundle yet". As exclusively revealed in Express 90, the Screen Gems bundle comes with a line up of new games and software packages including:

- Mindscape's high speed stock car racing game *Days of Thunder*. It's brand new, based on the Tom Cruise film of the same name and likely to be a huge hit.
- Back to the Future II from Mirrorsoft features five levels of arcade action lifted from the Spielberg's smash hit film.
- Ocean's intriguing subterranean adventure *The Flight Breed*.
- *Shadow of the Beast II* from Pygnosis. The original *Beast*

game is still one of the best Amiga games.

- Due to its popularity *Electronic Arts' Deluxe Paint II* is being kept in the package. This program offers users the chance to try their hand at all manner of computer art from simple doodles to three dimensional extravaganzas.

Screen Gems comes with a TV modulator, costs the usual £399 and will be available within a couple of weeks.

Meanwhile, a new bundle complete with a range of educational packages will be launched next week. Commodore isn't giving details although it is understood that the package will be broadly similar to the Class of the '90s pack first unveiled a year ago.

'A5000' gives an ordinary Amiga incredible speed

AMAZING £400 A500 POWER UPGRADE

A sub-£400 upgrade kit for the Amiga is to be launched which is capable of transforming an ordinary A500 into a machine with the potential of more computing power than a dedicated graphics workstation.

Solid State Leisure's A5000 kit is a compilation of various upgrade modules which, it is being claimed, can improve an Amiga's running speed by 600 per cent and add a huge 4Mb of memory while still maintain 100 per cent software compatibility with Amiga programs.

The A5000 can take the A500 or A2000 into the serious workstation league. Originally from Bulgaria, the circuit board contains a 68020 processor, and in its various configurations can run at 16, 20 or 25MHz. Prices for the three

boards are £399, £499 and £599 including VAT and delivery.

All of the boards can support a maths co-processor running at up to 50MHz allowing serious number crunching at high speed.

Many add on accelerator boards for the Amiga have had compatibility problems with straight 68000 code causing games and applications to fail. But the A5000 gets round this with a claimed 68000 fallback mode that allows the machine to run in a normal way.

This true 32-bit upgrade for the Amiga is installed by simply removing the 68000 chip from the Amiga motherboard and inserting the board into the empty socket. No soldering is required - but it's not a job for someone who doesn't feel

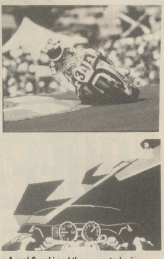
happy opening up the Amiga and thereby invalidating the machine's guarantee.

In short, the A5000 is 30 per cent faster than the 20-Card that it supersedes and also allows the lesser Amigas an economical entry into the higher levels.

For serious buyers a brand new A500 with A5000 card, hard drive, monitor and all the other extras necessary to do the job of a workstation could be put together for under £2,000, a considerable saving on the cost of a workstation or even Commodore's own Amiga 3000.

Solid State's boss Mark Tenney told Express: "Using the A5000 any Amiga owner can upgrade past the Amiga 3000 and into the realm of a workstation."

Speed freaks

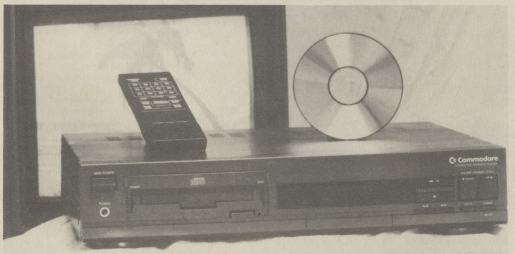
Now the high-speed - and rarely vertical - world of 500cc bike racing is available to Amiga and ST owners everywhere.

Grenlin has launched *Team Suzuki* and is insisting that it's so good even they never tire of playing it (sorry).

In the finest traditions of games development, Grenlin went along to Donnington Park to show Garry Taylor (the boss of the real life *Team Suzuki*) how the game was progressing just before the British Grand Prix - won by Kevin Schwantz on a Suzuki (luck that).

The game takes place over a complete Grand Prix season and accurately represents all the tracks. The player can view the action from the stands as well as from on the bike and this point of view was developed from videos shot from the front of an actual Suzuki.

Lukewarm welcome for anti-hacker act

The Computer Misuse Act came into force on August 29 and got a mixed reception.

The act, introduced as a private member's bill by Tory MP Michael Colvin, makes hacking (obtaining unauthorised access to a computer system) an offence carrying a penalty of up to six months imprisonment. There are two other clauses which penalise hacking with intent to commit further offences, and unauthorised

modification of computer material. This second clause is designed to cover both computer viruses and malicious damage to files and carries a penalty of up to five years imprisonment.

Peter Sumner, author of *The Hacker's Handbook*, has always felt there was no need for the new legislation and feared that this new Act could make it harder to prosecute criminal hackers.

Scotland Yard's computer crime squad is to be enlarged (there are four of them at the moment) and a spokesman said: "It all depends on people being aware a new crime exists and reporting offences to us."

The National Computing Centre warned that the act "will deter some potential hackers and fraudsters but is not intended to replace the need for good IT security practices. The difficult part will be catching the

miscreant and then demonstrating that they did not have authority to access or modify the system."

A further drawback is that, like any new legislation, it will be challenged by defence lawyers who will argue over the definitions used in the wording of the act.

This could make the first prosecutions long, costly – and from the Crown's point of view – not always successful. ■

New Amstrads on the way

This month will see the release of Amstrad's new top-end business range of computers – dubbed the 3000 series. The machines are likely to be beefed up versions of the 2000 series with structural improvements and minor performance tweaks.

Following a presentation to distributors and larger retail customers, the company is talking to dealers this week and has already briefed sections of the business computer press. The machines involved include a 286, 386 and a 386SX – all repackaged, redesigned and internally revamped to effectively push the PC2000 range further up market.

So far the reaction from invited audiences seems to be favourable. There is, as yet, no indication on price, but from Amstrad's point of view there is little point to the exercise unless PC3000s cost more than the 2000 range. Considering the way PC prices are moving at the moment however, this differential could be relatively small. ■

Computers seen as macho in primary schools

MICRO 'BULLY BOYS' SQUEEZE OUT GIRLS

Girls at primary schools are being driven away from class computers by bullying schoolboys who are turning the technology into a vehicle for 'masculine posturing'.

This claim is made by Dr John Benyon, the head of communication and media studies at the Polytechnic of Wales, who has made a study of several common masculine subcultures – including rugby players, boxers and martial arts enthusiasts.

His observations of 10-year-olds using an educational computer game showed that boys dominated the screen, insulted the girls' efforts and pushed them into the background.

Addressing the British Association for the Advancement of Science he said: "There were numerous examples of girls becoming so bored and frustrated at being excluded that a deep resentment towards and a dismissal of computers was brewing ... these 10-year-olds

were cutting off. I suggest that across the country generally this is the case.

"Computing is becoming a new area for boys to encode masculine values," he added and called for an examination of the cultural content of video games.

He explained: "Some researchers argue that computer games are frequently racist, sexist, militaristic and competitive in format, emphasising the joys of technical domination and mastery." Quite. ■

Showbiz at the CES

At noon on Thursday September 13, the first day of the EMAP Computer Entertainment Show Ester Rantzen and Frank Bruno will arrive to officially open proceedings – and they are unlikely to be the only famous names on view.

Radio One will be recording at the show, also on the Thursday, with selections being broadcast on Philip Schofield's show on the Sunday. Several industry characters such as Ocean's Robocop and Mirrorsport's Mutant Turtles, will be making an appearance and rumours abound of various pop stars popping in as well. One 'celebrity' who is definitely going to cause a stir at the show is the Super X flight simulator – a great success at the PC Show back in 1988. ■

A fair cop

The latest in PC data security locks is called Policeman and was developed by Plus 5 Engineering.

The device locks the entire computer, records unsuccessful attempts to enter the system and will set off an alarm on the third try.

Attached to the PC is a small, external enclosure which can read an electronic tag – which bears the PIN number of each authorised user. These 'Plus Tags' can be engraved with the user's name and are small enough to be carried on a key ring.

Once the Policeman has been attached to a computer the only form of access is by tag and PIN number – there is no 'back door'.

There is an added security level in the form of data encryption if required. Policeman costs £199. Plus 5 Engineering can be contacted on 0892 663211. ■

Ocean drops budget prices

Ocean, the UK's most successful games specialist, is about to enter the 16-bit budget market with prices certain to be less than £10.

In the past the company has enjoyed outstanding success with titles like *Robocop*, *Operation Wolf*, *Batman* and *Rainbow Islands* - so it's not impossible that even these might turn up on the new label.

At the moment, although the decision has definitely been taken, the company is reluctant to give any details of titles to be released, or even an accurate price. However five or six titles will be released in the first batch, probably during the Computer Entertainment Show at Olympia (13 - 16 September), followed by two a month thereafter.

The problem lies in providing a price low enough to encourage impulse buying, while still covering the high mechanical costs associated with 16-bit. This will certainly be less than £10, with £7.99 as the most likely choice.

Ocean already has the popular Hit Squad budget label for 8-bit games and that label is likely to be retained for this new 16-bit venture, perhaps with a redesign on packaging aimed at ST and Amiga users. ■

Double up

PC users will soon be able to double the effective capacity of their hard disks, following the development of a new utility by Vartisoft Systems of San Francisco, California.

Called *DoubleDisk*, the memory-resident utility can be installed from a floppy and creates an additional, logical DOS 'extended disk' from a portion of the hard drive - without reformatting it.

Whenever a file is saved to an extended disk, *DoubleDisk* automatically compresses it by an average 50 per cent. Files anywhere in the system are accessed normally, whether on the extended disk or standard DOS drive. There are no UK details as yet. ■

Amiga 3D

A breakthrough in ray-traced animation software for the Amiga, called *Real 3D*, is to be distributed in Britain by The Amiga Centre Scotland, following a deal with Activa Software of Sweden.

Real 3D is claimed to be the fastest ray tracing program available for the Amiga and will come in three versions. The beginners package will include all the features except macros and Boolean operations and will run with 1Mb of memory.

Professional is the full package, but requires 3Mb, and Turbo is another 3Mb full package, especially written to take advantage of more powerful chips like the 68020 and 68030.

Features of *Real 3D* include: various materials (glass, mirror, etc.), texture mapping, unlimited light sources, surface mapping, true solid modeling, real time wireframe preview, hierarchical structures and quick animation preview. ■

The computer dealer who never was

Several UK distributors have been defrauded by a con artist who has impersonated well known dealers and ordered equipment to be delivered to third parties. The value of the kit obtained has varied between £3,000 and £20,000.

A police spokesman

explained: "He has telephoned distributors and claimed to be a dealer with whom he knew they had a credit arrangement. He would then ask for urgent delivery to be made at a third party address at a specified time and intercept the equipment, either at the foyer of

a building with a computer company in it or at an office he'd rented for the occasion."

The thefts only came to light when invoices were queried, but sometimes not until months later.

Police were called in after a distributor, who prefers to

remain anonymous, received an order from an unfamiliar name claiming to be from a regular customer. The shipping address turned out to be false.

A man has been arrested and charged and magistrates have referred the case to the Crown Court. ■

Californian granted patent for the microprocessor

MILLIONS AT STAKE IN BATTLE OF THE CHIPS

A 52-year old Californian computer engineer has finally been granted a patent for the invention of a computer on a chip in 1968. His battle to be recognised as the man who was first with a fully integrated circuit computer could cost the industry's chip manufacturers a fortune.

Gilbert Hyatt has been fighting the Californian Patents Office for the past 20 years to get his patent recognised. He originally filed his patent, entitled 'Single Chip Circuit Computer Architecture' in 1970, but had to face two denials and two appeals before the office finally agreed.

This means he patented the idea before multi-million dollar corporations such as Intel, Texas Instruments and Motorola. The legal implications have to be worked out, but these companies could owe Hyatt millions of dollars.

It has always been taken as fact that the originators of a computer on a chip were one of Intel's development teams. However, their patent was filed later than that of Hyatt.

Hyatt said last week: "The work I did is the forerunner of PC. I don't know if all PCs are using the same technology in the patents, but they sure stem from the work I did."

He says he won't be seeking retroactive payments - which would run into billions of dollars - but could be eligible for royalties on all computers which contain his technology.

Brian Rooney of United Press International reported: "Silicon Valley patent attorneys said Hyatt's patent appeared on its face to be very broad and could cover virtually all types of microprocessors. If so he would be entitled to royalties for all microprocessors

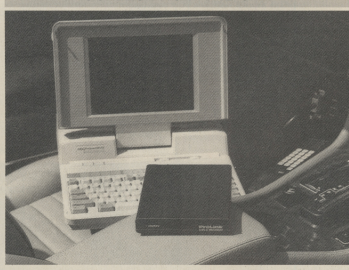
manufactured for 17 years after the patent was issued."

According to Newsbytes, if Hyatt was to take an 0.5 per cent royalty on Intel's and Motorola's yearly revenues he would make \$22 million. Hyatt says whatever money he gains will be sunk into new scientific projects.

When the original patent was filed he ran a company called Micro Computer Inc, but that foundered in the early 1970s. Hyatt says he isn't bitter at not being recognised but claims that, had he been given the money in the first place, he could have come up with some "really marvelous technology".

Whatever the outcome, Hyatt is likely to be embroiled in some sticky legal battles for the next few years. * On news of the verdict coming out, Intel's share price took a dive on the New York stock exchange. ■

COMMS FROM THE CAR



• NEC has launched the first cellular modem for on-the-move communications. The ProLink CDLC transfers data by cellular radio waves in exactly the same way as a car telephone. It is compatible with Vodafone and Cellnet networks in the UK and operates at a moderate 2.4 baud.

NEC is researching an all-in-one office for the car and is already offering a bundle of portable computer, car telephone, car fax and cellular modem.

The CDLC costs £695. Contact your local dealer for more information. ■

Plastic Macs arrive at last

Three 'economy' Apple Macintoshes are in production in California, with delivery scheduled for the autumn, though full details are only available on two: the Mac Ixi and the LC.

The Mac Ixi is a high performance machine with built-in 8-bit colour, similar to the Icli, plus a single slot that can be used to run Processor Direct Slot cards or NuBus cards. It's about 1.5 inches shorter than the three-slot Icli with a logic board a third smaller and looks rather like an Apple IGS. It uses a 20MHz 68030 processor, which makes it six times faster than the Mac Plus, and it will accommodate up to 17Mb of RAM.

There is also a built-in 8-bit audio digitiser and a microphone jack on the back and a microphone is expected to be included.

The LC is an inch and a half shorter than the Ixi and will not be as expandable. There's a 20MHz 68020 (2.5 times faster than a Mac Plus) with built-in 8-bit colour and up to 9Mb of RAM on the motherboard.

The third Mac is the Classic which will have a 8MHz 68000 processor and a mono monitor - it has no expansion slots. ■

- Bug-busting Microwillusions has finally released an upgrade to Music-X.

After months of waiting, Microwillusions has finally released the upgrade of its successful Music-X MIDI sequencing system onto the European market. The upgrade has been available Stateside for several months now, but has failed to reach UK users.

For registered users, the upgrade is available for just £19.95 when you send them your Music-X disks back to Microwillusions at its usual address. Anyway, here's what the new version has to offer:

- Multi-serial capabilities - Music-X now has the ability to communicate with more than one serial port at a time. It can talk to up to eight serial ports simultaneously (using a serial port expansion card such as that available from ASDC Inc.) in both directions, therefore allowing Music-X to address a theoretical 128 MIDI channels simultaneously.
- Event sculpting - This new feature allows you to 'sculpt' note velocities, continuous controller values, aftertouch, pitch bend etc using the mouse. By simply dragging the mouse across the bar editor screen, Music-X will redraw the particular control to conform directly to the path of the mouse.
- View controllers - You can now choose to display one type of controller at a time, or all controllers simultaneously.
- Velocity flattener - This works just like the Music-X velocity scaler, except that it sets the velocity to a constant value (which can also be ramped or randomised).
- Lock channels - It is now possible to lock the current MIDI channel from within the bar editor. This makes it easier to selectively edit data for a particular channel from within a multi-channel sequence.
- Sample tuning and envelope editor - Sample envelopes and tuning can be edited in realtime while sequences are playing.
- Bug fixes - All reported bugs from Music-X 1.0 have now been removed.

JUNIOR ARRIVES

Once again Microwillusions has made us all very happy by announcing that it's finally released the budget version of Music-X.

Contrary to previous reports, Microwillusions has decided to sell the program for an ultra low price of £80, which compares very well with the two other major budget sequencer systems available from Dr.T (Tiger Cub) and Passport (Tra). Music-X Junior offers 250 tracks of real time MIDI recording with comprehensive sequence editing using a powerful piano roll like bar editor. The program fully supports Amiga sampled sounds, therefore allowing multi-voice compositions to be built up from the simplest of hardware setups. Extra facilities include a MIDI filters page that acts like a MIDI patchbay, allowing MIDI data of various types to be channelled here, there and everywhere. Look out for a full review of Music-X Junior in a future issue of Express.

VICTORY IN THE GULF

AMOS UPDATE

I was recently lucky enough to be able to have a quick 'chin wag' with Francois Lionet, the programmer responsible for Mandarin's AMOS system. Francois informed me that he is currently working on an upgrade to AMOS that will include many enhancements suggested by users.

AMOS 1.2 will include the complete removal of all known bugs (which, as Francois pointed out, does not necessarily mean that AMOS is not totally bug free), a brand new file requester that is compatible with multi-tasking, an all new sprite flipping facility (that removes the need to store a sprite as both a normal and reversed image), plus several new commands (which provide increased support for multi-tasking).

After completing AMOS 1.2, Francois intends to start work on the AMOS compiler. This shouldn't take too long, as Francois intends basing the Amiga version around the existing STOS compiler.

Once this is complete, Francois intends extending the AMOS and STOS series still further with the release of a PC version of AMOS, (the obvious name is PCOS but Francois didn't seem to like this name at all).

Also on the drawing board is an enhanced version of STOS (called STOS Professional) which will basically bring STOS up to

Psygnosis • £34.95



After defeating Maletho, the Beast Lord, and his servant Zelek, the Beast Mage, the warrior messenger has managed to regain his human form and return to the safety of his family once more. The Beast Lord is none too happy about Zelek and his minion's bunglings that have allowed the messenger to escape, and so instigates a search for another child on which to carry out their macabre experiments.

After months of searching, one of Zelek's slaves returns to his dark tower to inform his master that a suitable child has been found. Zelek transforms into his beast-image and flies off to find the baby. When he reaches the home of the child, thoughts of revenge against the messenger grow - since the child they have found is his sister. With malice in his heart he swoops down and snatches the baby from its mother, flying off over the mountains to the realm of the Beast Lord.

You play the warrior-messenger from the original game, this time in human form. You must travel through the realm of Kara-Moon in an attempt to rescue your baby sister from the evil Beast Lord. Along the way you come across various creatures, some of them the mutated servants of Zelek, who will stop at nothing to try and destroy you, some are simply warrior-like tribes people, who will defend their lands to the death, and others are friendly beings - tired of living under the rule of Maletho and Zelek - who will give you hints to help you on your way.

As you'd expect from Psygnosis, the presentation of Shadow of the Beast II is very polished, with an atmospheric intro-sequence leading into a game with superbly designed graphics and ethereal sound effects. The technical prowess of the game isn't as impressive as its predecessor (the five-level parallax scrolling has been simplified to a simple two-level, multi-directional scroll), but on the whole more care seems to have been taken to evoke a dark and mysterious atmosphere. The weapons too has been improved, with more frantic action and a range of weapons to use in battle. The inclusion of puzzles and clues gives the game a more adventurous leaning than the original, and make the proceedings a much more interesting and addictive game.

Even if you weren't too impressed with Beast I, give the sequel a try. The feel is more moody and the gameplay more involved - in fact it seems as though Impressions has taken heed of the criticism given to the original, and made Shadow of the Beast the game it should have been.

DPAIN! BOOSTS ST

The new last week in Express that Electronic Arts has finally capitulated to popular demand and released an ST version of its classic Deluxe Paint art program is cause for celebration.

It's not as if the ST isn't well served in the art department - the public domain programs Neochrome, Degas Elite and Spectrum 512 have all done their bit to take advantage of the ST's excellent graphics capabilities.

But nothing comes close to the £50 DPain! ST package. It is brim-full of features and functions that go way beyond what has been done before. There's even a complete animation system, something which I think I'm right in saying has only been available in the excellent CyberPaint.

What may raise eyebrows, however, is Express' revelation last week that DPain! has nothing to do with Dan Silva, the man who worked for four years on that series on other formats.

For one thing the icon system, familiar to anyone who's seen the program on other machines, has been repositioned so that they're now horizontal rather than vertical at the side of the screen.

In fact DPain! began life not as DPain! at all, but as a program brought to Electronic Arts and taken over and developed by them.

But you don't have to take my word for it that DPain! ST is in the same class as its predecessors. The October issue of ST Format has a fully usable demo on the cover disk, featuring everything except some of the animation elements and, of course, the save option.

DRAGONFLIGHT

Thalion/Active • £34.99



It's been three years in the pipeline and has been handled by three different UK distributors before ending up in Active's lap. Now Dragonflight is ready to storm onto the adventure scene and all the signs are that it's got a healthy future ahead of it. Already number one in Germany, Dragonflight has all the essential ingredients necessary to see it climb the UK adventure charts faster than an Inter-City.

The game comes with a 104-page novella which tells the story of how magic and dragons, once beautiful in the region have all but vanished. Your objective is to save humans, dears and elves from evil powers. To accomplish this task you control four characters - a human, an elf, a wizard and a dwarf. Each of them start the game with limited amounts of food and money, and one of the 'four kings of Stasis'. The wizard also carries a piece of the map. As you explore the enormous landscape you may collect the other 11 pieces.

The game is played out on a large map with a panel running along the bottom of the display. This panel shows your four characters and lists their inventory along with movement and spell icons. The map itself gives an overhead view of the landscape in a similar fashion to the Ultima games. You can frequent shops, inns and visit the residents of houses. When you come up against enemy monsters the display changes to view characters from the side. Combat proceeds in turns, with you advancing each member of your team forward until you're in the line of sight of the enemy. Dispatch a well-timed fireball and you can win the battle. Such battle sequences are fun and certainly live up to the action.

It's unfortunate that adventure programmers refuse to come up with any original game scenarios. Dragonflight successfully incorporates elements from other popular role-playing games but it's in dire need of something original. A unique plot with scope for varied graphics would have given it the edge it needs. 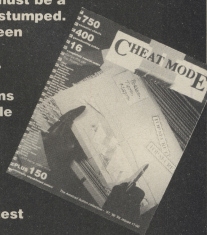

SPECTRUM

PLUS D AND THE DISCIPLES

A fair few Speccy owning households have a Plus D or Disciple disk-interface and although I've never used one myself, the general opinion seems to be that they're absolutely excellent. Designed and originally sold by MGT (the Plus D is still available from Data Electronics), both these devices bring the hi-tech wonder of a 3.5-inch or 5.25-inch disk drive to the humble Speccy. I mention them because I've just heard from Barry Turner, the Editor of *NewWord* - a zero/disk based publication for Plus D and Disciple users. This comes out every month and apparently contains programs, tips and other things of interest for owners of the aforementioned widgets. Each issue costs £1 (£1.50 outside UK) on tape or 3.5-inch/5.25-inch on disk if you supply one with your order. The address is: 38 Kings Drive, Gravesend, Kent DA12 5BJ. Barry also supplied the following tips gleaned through years of playing around with the interfaces:

1) If you keep all your transferred games on disks separate from other programs, save the system file by first loading the Disciple leader software. First choose not to use the printer, then no flashing border and finally no network. Then, save the system file to your disk of transferred games. Some games, when snap-shotted, don't like the Plus D/Disciple over-writing the printer channel.

2) Keep games with the same first letter on the same disk; this saves you having to have a catalogue or database reminding you which disk you have transferred a particular game to.

3) If you want to name disks it is quite easy, as the Plus D/Disciple only checks the first three letters of the system file. So, for example, to name Games Disk 1 just change the system file by ERASE d1"SYS" to "Sys

Games", or in the case of the Plus D ERASE d1"SYS" to "SYS Games".

GHOSTS

I'm proud to present the third and final part of Ghost, the program that decreases swearing, high blood pressure and the practice of hair tearing by making your Plus 2A or Plus 3 compatible with loads of Speccy software that just wouldn't load before. To get it working, simply type in the entire listing that's been printed in the last two issues of Express with the final part appearing below. Run it and, if everything goes according to plan, the computer will reset. Now type in Listing 2 (the two line program below), and then Run 20 to save a few copies. If you can't summon up the energy to bash the whole thing out or by some huge oversight missed the appropriate issues of Express, then the entire program can be yours if you send an SAE and a blank cassette (or an SAE and 10p for a photocopied version) to the very clever author: Mr Harris, 1 Salters Lane, Faversham, Kent ME13 8YD. And if you do send off for it remember to thank good old Miktor for writing it in the first place and bringing a ray of sunshine to Plus 3/Plus 2A owners' dismal lives.

PIPS HAVE GONE

The final few options you can use with PIP:

- [F] Tabs. Changes tab characters into x spaces.
- [U] Upper case. Changes all lower case (abc) in the file to upper case (ABC).
- [V] Verify. Checks that the file has been transferred by comparing source and destination files.
- [W] Write over. Writes over files set to 'read only' automatically - normally it asks for confirmation.
- [X], [Y] Nothing
- [Z] Zero parity bit. Sets the eighth bit in each character to zero, effectively stripping out *Protext* printer codes. *NewWord* dot commands etc. are great for converting *NewWord/WordStar* files into sensible ASCII files.

LAST VIEWS

MSX

FOND FAREWELL

This is a very sad day for me, because this is the last time that you will see the MSX column in Express. The publisher has decided to axe all the minor format columns, and unfortunately this includes our MSX column. Due to the short notice of this decision, I therefore have to squeeze as much info into this last edition as possible. It also means that there will not be room for some items of news, but never mind, let's mention as much as possible.

Firstly some software news: Zepelin Software has just released a game called *Spaghetti Western* on the MSX format, price £2.99, and the Addictive game *Football Manager World Cup Edition* should be available as you read this. Better late than never, eh? Also catch out for more titles from Blade Software, if games like *Lords Of Chaos* and others drew you out towards the end of the year.

I have briefly tried out the two pieces of software that I mentioned in last week's column, namely the CAD version 4 that MSX Link are distributing, and also the FMPac music cartridge that *Network* magazine has lent me.

CAD

The CAD program, priced at only £5, is a really excellent graphics program that not only allows you to draw your own pictures, but also contains several digitised pictures that can be loaded in and manipulated. There are animation sequences that can be loaded and run, and the whole program, which is menu-driven and mouse compatible, is highly sophisticated. Although some of the operations that the program performs are sometimes a little slow, overall the package is fantastic value, and is a must for any MSX 2 owner. There is one picture in the package called *King Tut*, which is the digitised picture of Tutankhamun, and believe me it is as good as any I have seen on certain 16-bit computers. If you wish to purchase a copy of CAD, phone MSX Link on: 0775 711108. I'm impressed and I am sure you will be.

The second item, the FMPac, is a cartridge based utility that plugs into one of an MSX's 0, 2, and allows you to produce sounds and music over nine channels simultaneously. Thus it gives you the same sound capabilities as an MSX 2 Plus. The FMPac is unfortunately unavailable in the UK at present, but hopes are high that more will be imported soon. Look for details in the news pages of Express, as this is where you will need to look for MSX info now.

SEND IN THE TANKS!

Just in case you need a change from alien-blasting, car-crashing and naja-booting, I thought I'd tell you about the latest release from Cases Computer Simulations - *Battle of the Bulge*.

The *Battle of the Bulge*, for all those who weren't there, was the last major European campaign of World War II. It represented Hitler's last desperate attempt to burst through the advancing Allied forces and, in the process, revitalise the ailing morale of the German army. It didn't work.

Having said that, the German campaign, if it had succeeded, would have gone down in the history books as one of the most inspired pieces of military thinking this century. In mid-December 1944, German Panzers drove deep into the Ardennes, while commandos dressed as American officers parachuted into the midst of their forces to redirect and generally confuse the enemy... (That's enough history - Ed.)

Of course, as with all wargames, the historical facts are one thing - what happens when you play out the scenario is another. Here is your chance to rewrite the history books, to pit your own wits against either the German or Allied forces - to find out how the war would have gone if you'd been in charge.

Cases' *Battle of the Bulge* lets you play either the good guys or the bad guys. Your opponent can either be another wargaming psycho or the computer. You can also change the weather conditions, delay Patton's relief

army and otherwise mess around with history. The game has only an 'easy' and a 'hard' level, but throw in all the other variations you can specify at the start, and you can tailor the battle almost at will.

So far so good. Unfortunately, to gamers used to the fast, slick graphics of the latest arcade conversion, *Battle of the Bulge* will look pretty grim. Your total map area is some 70 miles square, and there's no overall map to display the disposition of your forces. Consequently, the game involves a lot of scrolling around, and this is both slow and jerky. Your units are identified by symbols representing tanks, artillery etc and you give orders by first selecting the unit, then your order.

When it comes to the battles proper, you don't get to see any pyrotechnics at all. Instead, you must simply examine all your units afterwards to see how much damage they've sustained. If they're severely shot up they'll retreat automatically.

The game is fine in itself, but the execution leaves a lot to be desired. The map of the terrain is crude and simplistic, and each turn requires lots of tedious keystrokes.

However, once you settle down to realise you're playing a strategic simulation rather than a glibly arcade blast, it's not a bad game. Price? Ah, well, it's a slightly sticky £12.95 on cassette, but the standard £14.95 on disk.

WAIVE'S WINNERS

Good news for anyone pondering the

purchase of the Amsoft Supercalc spreadsheet, but put off by the price: Wave is now selling the program for £24.95, plus £3.45 P&P. Not bad, eh? In addition, Wave has got hold of a large number of FD-1 drives (the ones without the interface) and is selling them off at the absurd price of £49.95! Call Wave on 0229 870000 for all the details.

CONSOLE WORRIES

F Sheikh, of Redbridge, Essex, is worried about the new Amstrad console:

"I recently heard that the new Amstrad console was to be released very soon and I received this news with mixed feelings.

"Firstly, the good points. The console will bring a lot of much-needed attention to the CPC scene, which I feel has been neglected in recent times. This will hopefully produce more games and reviews for Amstrads - especially the latter, as many multi-format magazines there are usually only one or two reviews.

"But there may be a very serious side-effect to this. The 464, 664 and 6128 owners may be in danger of being completely forgotten as everyone goes mad about the console. Companies may churn out games for the cartridge-based users, but eventually phase out the older generation.

"This may not turn out to be the case - software companies may wait to see how sales of the console go before producing games - but I still wait in anxiety for the release.

Well, for a start, you won't have to wait much longer. All being well, the new console and Fluses will be in the shops for early October. But as for this spelling the death-knell for the old machines, that's another matter entirely.

For a start, cartridge games are going to cost £25-30, twice the price of existing software. That factor alone is enough to generate a new market rather than simply take over from the old one. And don't forget that the budget market has co-existed peacefully with the full-price market for ages. No, rather than seeing the current tape/disk software releases drying up, I think we're going to get an additional 'in-between' market. It's going to be some time, after all, before the majority of software producers can be convinced to move into cartridge software, if ever.

And even the 'old' CPC hardware turns in a pretty creditable games playing performance. When you look at the likes of *Laser Squad* and *E-Motion*, it's hard to imagine those being much improved in an Amstrad console version.

The most likely eventuality is that we'll see publishers choosing whether to release a particular game in cartridge or tape/disk form.

Major film tie-ins and arcade licences will probably end up on the console, while original product is likely to appear on tape/disk.

THE END IS NIGH

All good things must come to an end and so, alas, this is the very last BBC column. I've enjoyed writing it, and I hope my readers have enjoyed it too. No regrets though as times change and we must all move with those times.

You must all be asking if this means the end of Beeb coverage by Express, but the answer is no. Beeb events and news items will still be covered in the relevant parts of the magazine.

You may even see my name from time to time, as the editor had requested that I continue to contribute items whenever something interesting comes up. In the home market that now means rarely or never, but a different set of conditions prevails in the education market, where new software packages for the Beeb are still a common event.

UPGRADING

For most Beeb owners that other schools, the questions that must be asked at some time are:-

- Do I upgrade?
- What do I upgrade to?
- When do I upgrade?

The short answers are:

- Yes
- The Archimedes
- Wait a little

The reasons behind my recommendations are as follows:

The time to upgrade is when newer machines offer software that is functionally superior to, as well as being easier to use, than your current choices. That time has now finally arrived.

The Archimedes provides a good degree of backward compatibility through its 165Host and 165Tube applications, and the BASIC 5 used by the machine is a direct descendant of BBC BASIC.

The Arc is fast, expandable, and capable of running PC software through its emulator. It may be worth considering a PC clone or Amiga, if your preference is for business software or games respectively.

WORTH WAITING

I suggest you hold on at least a couple of months, however, because I think Acorn will be just launching a new, cheaper Archimedes machine in time for Christmas, and there may be some good bundles on offer.

Credit may be difficult to get, so watch out for companies offering zero per cent interest rates, and snatch their hand off

STORY TIME

And finally, a tip to read a short story by my favourite author, Ray Bradbury called: *Some Live Like Lazarus*.

If you want to know why, and what it's got to do with this column and the Beeb, then you'll just have to read it. You can find it (and 19 other excellent stories) in a paperback called, *The Machineries of Joy* (Grafton Books).

PCB CAD

Although a couple of CAD programs for generating printed circuit boards (PCB) artwork for the QL have been around for some time, they weren't particularly capable. Now, Lear Data Systems has produced a package that, on paper at least, looks nearly as good as the very popular Easy PC for PC users, which I've been using for some time.

Features include a 32-inch by 32-inch drawing area, resolution down to .001inch, up to 16 layers, a virtually unlimited number of components, surface mount capability etc.

Output can be to a dot-matrix printer, a pen plotter, or a laser printer. Unfortunately, output of Gerber-compatible photo-plotter files isn't available - this is essential for high quality multi-layer boards.

DIODE TIP

Those of you who are handy with a soldering iron might be interested in a tip from John Butterworth, mentioned in the latest issue of the group's newsletter.

He found that putting a silicon diode in series with the nominal 5V output from the power supply (reducing the voltage by around half a volt) cured a lock-up problem that was affecting his machine. Something like a 1N0004 should be suitable.

DESKTOP OFFICE

Inspired no doubt by the outrageously successful *Minu* of Acorn, Minerva has come up with *Desktop Office* - word processor, database, spreadsheet, chart drawing and a comms package all in one. Functional *FD* rate it.

The software has a pleasing look about it - real *RIS*Ware. *DTO* Word is a character mode word processor, (no fancy outline fonts here) with all the usual bits and bobs. If familiarity breeds content, then this should please almost everyone. When a word processor displays the embedded commands in green, you know right where you stand, don't you - the low rolling hills of *Wordwise* country.

But there are some cute touches; go to the fifth paragraph; insert the current date or time; insert the text from some other file. These help to dispel an air of 8-bitness. In capability, *FD* put it some way below *First Word Plus*: no graphics and no spelling.

DTO Sheet is basic, really basic. There are just 14 functions, and that's counting addition and subtraction! The spreadsheet is 32 cells by 64, rather puny if you stack it against the likes of *Pipedream*. But on reflection, just how often do you build a model with more than about 28 columns. One for each month, two year's worth, a column for labels and a few for the totals. And when did you last use that logarithm function? Again there are nice touches - a special *Graphing* and comms are pretty fun.

fundamental stuff too, although the comms pack can interpret *AcTerm*-style script files. Automated logging-on, e-mail collection and so on is perfectly possible.

As bells *Minerva*, the *DTO* database is the star. *MultiStore* it ain't, but you can paint your own card layout, put in text, integer, real number or date fields up to 80 characters long and so on. Date formats are particularly flexible. You can mark cards, either manually as you browse through the data, or by searching for something in particular, just as with *MultiStore* and *Flexfile*. And marked cards can be pulled out into a report.

One of the nicest features is the maiming. A *Get Database* command in *DTO* Word identifies the database to use, and you just name the fields you want at the right part of the letter. The integration of the five modules is strong, you can usually run at least two at a time in a 1Mo machine, and passing files to *Edit*, *Pipedream* and so on is easy.

PUZZLED EXPRESSION

Last week's news of Acorn's *Schema* spreadsheet (which, after a gestation period exceeded only by that of an elephant, has been delivered into the hands of Clares), raises but one question - what has happened to *Expression*? This was to be Acorn's 'document processor', based on *MacAuthor*.

Has this too been sold off, or just put back in the postbox marked 'not known at this address'? Can't track it down yet.

I hope that Acorn's dropping of all applications software development will mean a rebalancing of effort on system software. It's ironic that Acorn is taking the opposite tack to its erstwhile role-model, Apple. It has just gone back on an earlier decision to float off Claris, the equivalent of *Acornsoft*. Claris has been hounded back, reportedly so that Apple can make sure that there is at least some software ready to use all the whizzo new features of *System Seven*, the impending new Mac operating system. New features like outline fonts, sign, communication between applications, yawn, screen multi-tasking... zzz. They make it sound all so new.

Wholly monochrome palette3s Files which define the colours of the screen or of a sprite, are real easy to create. The palette utility is the first desktop toy that a novice *Acroner* fiddles with. Next end up returning the colours to normal in the end, because the default set is fairly well chosen. But that palette editor causes untold frustration: if you save the screen (see last week's *Express*) to disk as a sprite, then try to print out with *Paint*, you'll see the problem. You just can't get rid of those embarrassing stains. All the white on screen prints as a pale shade of grey. Confusing, huh? Think of a normal palette file, eight shades from black to white. Brightness can vary from zero to 255, that's 256 levels. And 256 divided by 8 is 32. So black is zero, the darkest grey is 32, then next one is 64... and

white is 224. Er, perhaps not. A brightness of 224 really is white if you can't print eight shades. But the printer drivers cope with 64 shades of grey, and 224 is some way down the list from pure white. In fact, the default palette white is 240, but the same applies.

Acorn says that each half of every brightness byte in a palette file should be set to the same value (in hexadecimal). So black stays at zero, the first grey becomes 34 (&22 in hex), the next is 68 (&44)... and white is 238 (&EE in hex). Closer, but still no cigar. You won't build a nice, neat, linear scale from zero to 255 that way. And the palette utility doesn't follow the rules anyway. The only correct way to do it is to divide 255 by 7 (for eight shades) or by 15 (for a wholly monochrome palette). So the palette values are 0, 36, 73, 109, 146, 182, 219 and 255 for eight shades. I never had this problem with my ZX81.

The solution is easy. Create a modified palette file and add it to any sprites that print in grey - you can add a new palette to a sprite by dragging the palette file into *Paint*'s editing window.

You can use *Paint* to modify the default palette file - you'll spot the palette entries as they are eight sets of three identical characters in the first half of the file. Replace each group of three with three 255s, three 219s and so on. Remember, to enter a 219 character (whatever that is), you can just hold down the [Alt] key and type 219 on the numeric keypad. NEW DOS ON THE BLOCK

Microsoft in the States is beginning to talk about the features that will be seen in a new version of MS-DOS which is due out soon. For some reason it is denying that it will be called DOS 5 - perhaps the trauma it suffered over the bugs in DOS 4 has put it off making the jump to a new number again so soon.

High on the features list is support for memory beyond the 640K, using the method used by Windows 3 - called the Virtual Control Program Interface.

For those of without a 386, an improved version of BACKUP is promised, as is a better text editor. And new and more powerful wildcards will make file selection easier.

Microsoft is keeping tight lipped about a release date for

the new DOS, but keep your eyes peeled around Christmas time.

Microsoft will have to get it act together to better Digital Research's DR-DOS 5.0, which we mentioned last week.

UP THE GARDEN PATH

So you have just quit out of a session using Microsoft Works, you find yourself in the directory C:\works\files\letters and you want to format a disk. You type FORMAT and DOS helpfully responds: 'Bad command or file not found'.

Now you can either remember that the FORMAT.EXE is in the MS-DOS directory and type:

C:\MS-DOS\FORMAT /A /S

or whatever; or you can set up DOS to always look in the MS-DOS directory when you give it a command. The command you use to do this is called PATH.

To use PATH you type the command followed by a list of directories separated by semicolons. If DOS can't find the program you tried to run in the current directory which you are in, it will then check through the directories in the PATH list, in order.

A typical PATH statement might be:

PATH C:\DOS;C:\WINDOWS

After you issue this command DOS will look in the following directories in order:

- The current directory
- The root directory (c:/)
- DOS
- \WIN
- \WORKS

If it can't find the program in any of these it will finally give the 'File not found' error.

Judicious use of the PATH command can save a lot of typing at the command line, and it is a good idea to include a PATH statement with your most commonly used directories in the autobac.bat file. Do this with a text editor or word processor - next week we'll take a look at setting up the system files in more detail.

If you want to check what directories are in the currently active PATH command, typing PATH on its own will print a list.

SPEED KING



• Get your PC going faster with the Power Pak.

We all want our computers to go faster. Even though most of us don't actually need more speed for our word processing, a beeper Norton rating brings a glow of pride to a PC owner's face.

Unfortunately more speed usually means better hardware and that invokes the twin evils of computing - screwdrivers and cheque books.

But if you can't face shelling out for that 386 just yet, there is a way of increasing your machine's poke without adding so much as an accelerated RAM chip.

The PC-Kwik Power Pak is a 100 per cent software package which claims to increase the speed of your PC by as much as four times. It consists of a set of utilities which speed up various parts of your system, such as hard disk access, screen redrawing and the keyboard.

The core of the Power Pak is the hard disk cache. What this does is to store the most recent data you have read from the disk in RAM, on the basis that if you've looked at it once the chances are you'll want to look at it again. Because of the way most programs work this is a pretty good assumption and the data your program needs can be found in the RAM as often as 70 or 80 per cent of the time. This speeds things up because the average access time of a hard disk is 40ms (1/25 of a second) while RAM has an access time of around 100ns (1/10,000,000 of a second). You see the advantage.

The disadvantage is that the cache needs RAM to store the data. And every byte used by the cache is a byte your programs can't touch. So while a disk cache can help with a very-disk intensive program, most of the time you don't want it cluttering up your precious 640K. If you have more than 640K however you're laughing. Most machines these days come with as megabytes of memory and, while programs can't use the extra 384K, the cache can.

What sort of performance increase can you expect? Well that rather depends on the kind of work you are doing and how much memory you can spare for the cache, but the Power Pak upped the Norton Disk Index of my machine from 1.7 to 6.8, and that's a difference you notice while working.

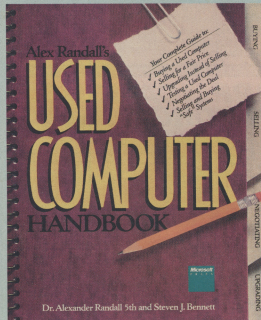
The rest of the Power Pak consists of a number of smaller utilities. A print spooler saves you waiting for the printer to finish before carrying on working. A RAM disk lets you store files in memory rather than on disk - be careful with these, RAM disks are fast but it's easy to forget that hitting Save doesn't keep a permanent copy of your files unless you copy them from the RAM disk to the hard disk. A keyboard accelerator speeds up the repeat rate, letting you zip around spreadsheets faster. Finally, a screen accelerator speeds up text-only screen drawing by replacing the BIOS routines with its own optimised ones. The main effect of this seems to be to make the directory listing fly even faster so you have even less chance of reading it before it goes off the top of the screen. (Yes I know how to stop it, but do you remember to add the more the first time?)

So far I haven't mentioned anything which makes the Power Pak more than a compilation of utilities, equivalents of which are available from the public domain for the price of a disk. Well the Power Pak is well put together and has a good manual, but the thing which really sets it apart is the integrated nature of the utilities.

The disk cache, RAM disk and print-spooler all share the same area of memory and swap it between them as required. So any free memory not used by RAM disk files is temporarily used as disk cache space until you save a file to it. This is ingenious and makes the RAM disk a practical proposition in a machine without vast amounts of memory.

The PC-Kwik Power Pak is well worth a look if your machine is feeling annoyingly sluggish. It costs £113.85, from P&P on 0706 217744.

BUYER BEWARE



• Selling or buying a computer: get some advice.

The cheapest way of getting hold of a PC isn't to scour the bargains from the box shifters, but to look to the reter classified ads and get hold of a machine second-hand.

Unfortunately this path is full of pitfalls for the uninitiated, and if you are not careful you can end up with a lemon. That's where a new book from Microsoft Press comes in.

Alex Randall's Used Computer Handbook is 200 pages of buying hints - the computing equivalent of kicking the tyres and poking a finger at the spark plugs. Alex Randall is a well-known figure in the States, where he runs a used computer exchange and price information network, and knows his stuff when it comes to choosing a used PC.

As well as looking at the more obvious buying hints - "Turn the keyboard upside down and shake it. Do any keys fall off? They shouldn't" - Randall is also full of advice about negotiating a deal and establishing a reasonable going rate for a machine.

Also covered is selling a machine - in fact much of the advice works both ways.

To provide a balanced approach, Randall considers the advantages and disadvantages of upgrading your existing computer over getting a second-hand one.

The book is well written, but very American, and that's its main drawback. A lot of the information in the book - dealer addresses and phone numbers and the like - is specific to the US.

This book is worth a look if you are thinking of buying second-hand. It costs £12.95 from Microsoft Press (ISBN 1-55615-267-1).

THE SHOPPING EXPRESS GUIDE TO THE TOP WORD PROCESSORS

The most vital piece of computer software for most serious users is the word processor – many use their micro for nothing else. Here is the Express verdict on the best you can find for every machine

The most popular use for the micro is as a word processor. Its uses are many and everyone can benefit from it at one time or another.

Whether you intend to write to the *Times* as 'Angry of Pinner', write to thank Aunt Elspeth for the vellum bound copy of *Pilgrim's Progress* or send Jeffrey Archer running for the smelling salts with your latest thriller, a word processor is for you.

First things first, what is a word processor? It is an applications program that runs on your micro allowing you to use it as an intelligent typewriter. You can see the results of your typing before you print it and can correct mistakes, manipulate text and format documents on screen.

There's no need to print your document there and then, as it can be saved to cassette or disk and retrieved later for further additions, editing or printing.

The beauty of word processing is that you can set up and save commonly used layouts and letters and load them when needed to avoid repetitive typing.

Most word processors allow you to change margins and reformat text and any number of tab settings can be incorporated.

Common series of commands or keystrokes can be incorporated in macros in most word processors, allowing multiple commands at a single keystroke. This is also useful for saving strings of text. Commonly used phrases, addresses and phone numbers can be assigned to a macro.

The more comprehensive (for which read 'more expensive') word processors generally have spelling checkers, mail merge facilities, word counters, and some of the better ones can even display italics, bold type face and different text sizes on the screen.

The ability to present the document on screen as it will appear on paper is known as WYSIWYG (What You See Is What You Get) and this feature is becoming 'standard' on new software.

To combine a letter with names

and addresses in a database is called mail-merge and is especially useful to businesses who wish to send the same letter to different clients, or perhaps a student wanting to tailor a curriculum vitae to suit prospective employers.

Page numbering and titling can be handled by most programs, and some even allow footnotes, bibliographies and indexing to be incorporated.

As word processing becomes more advanced, features such as importing graphics, working on several documents at once and calling lists from databases increase the efficiency of a simple typist or a large multinational. We all need to write at some time, and the word processor takes some of the drudgery out of the task.

Francy learning another language? If Lingaphone is not exactly what you had in mind, then how about C? C is an extremely popular computer language. Many commercial programs are written in it, and if you know it, it's an invaluable qualification to have.

It's a high level language. In basic terms, that means it's not as complicated as machine code, but a darn sight more powerful than 'easy' languages like BASIC.

Unfortunately learning to program in C is far from easy. You can't just pick it up in a few minutes. So if you can't find someone who knows the lingo to teach you, proper reference material is necessary.

Walk into any bookshop though, and you'll find that the price of a decent book on the subject is prohibitive to say

the least. A commercial C package will cost you several limbs too.

PD comes to the rescue once again! For now you can get a complete C package, plus an in depth tutorial for the price of a few disks.

C Manual is written by Scandina-

vian programmer Anders Bjerk. It comes on three disks, packed with everything you need to learn the language. And in some ways, it's better than any book could ever be. The advantage with a software-based tutorial is that there can be real 'live' examples to illustrate the points. Books tend to rely on reams of boring listings that take hours to type in, and even then may not work because of typing errors. To test out the programs in this language lesson, all you need to do is load them in.

C Manual takes the beginner through all the stages involved in learning the language. From the first faltering steps through to advanced examples. Within a couple of weeks, you'll be a

programming wizard, maybe.

If you're going to take C seriously, you'll need something to write and run those programs on. *NorthC 1.1* is such a program, and allows you to edit and compile your programs. There are a lot of document files to wade through, which should help you get the best out of the program.

Both *NorthC* and *C Manual* are available from Amiganuts. They complement each other perfectly, so it may be a good idea to get them together. *NorthC* is on disk 645, while *C Manual* comes on disks 639A, B, and of course, C.

nusic disks are crammed with programs that all have one thing in common - they'll sound good!

For starters, there's a program that allows you to compose your own tunes and replay them. It's called *Xbox Music*, a strange name, but it's fun and easy to use. Plonk down the notes with the sound and play away. My efforts, unfortunately have everyone reaching for their earplugs. However, there are a couple of pre-defined tunes to show you how it should be done.

It's fairly basic stuff, the notes are laid one at a time, and no fancy effects are available. For budding leetweens though, it could be the start of great things to come.

There are a whole selection of jingles on the disk. Just click on one from the desktop, and you'll be treated to a few seconds of silly songs.

Many of the programs are demos of just what commercial packages will allow you to do. Of course you can't edit anything yourself with these, but you can lay back examples of what these programs are capable of. Hopefully, as far as the manufacturers are concerned, pressing you enough to go out and buy the full blown versions. Demos include *Popmusic* and *Mastersound*. Owners of the program *EZ-track* will also find a few pieces of music to run.

Speaktext has a synthesiser program that echoes everything you say in 'real' speech.

It really is quite remarkable. Type in a word or sentence and the program does its best to output the text - via the loudspeaker! It works surprisingly well, most of the words are spoken as typed. With more complicated sounds, its a case of trying to type the word as it sounds, rather than as it's spell.

Hours of fun are to be had getting the ST to tell you friends and family exactly what you think of them.

All these are available on Gunning's Music Disks three & four (the pair are available together for double sided drive owners).

WRITE ON

Feel that you should keep in touch more? What better way than writing a letter. But if your handwriting is anything like mine, then you'll have enough trouble reading your own scribbles, let alone any one else making out what it's supposed to be saying.

ST *Writer* is a PD word processor that has been put into the public domain by the mighty Atari itself. It allows you to create your masterpiece, save it to disk, and print it out on your printer.

As well as typing in the words, the beauty of a word processor is that you

can change things after you've written them. If you make a mistake, or change your mind about what you've just written, you can simply rub it out and put it right. Taking this a step further, it's easy to move whole chunks of text around, so sentences can be moved around without having to re-write them.

There are 6 word specials available too. There are facilities for search and replace, so if you want to send the same letter to ten different people you know, then it's simple to replace the names.

Text can be justified in a number of ways, useful for getting rid of those

ragged edges. You can centre things too. Great for your letter headings.

The program will work in any of the modes that the ST is capable of displaying. So if you have the mono monitor you'll be able to use it with loads of high resolution characters on the screen, whereas if your machine's plugged into the 26 inch living room telly, you'll still be able to make out the letters.

It's not the best word processor around, but it does it's job well, and is certainly better than pen and paper. One of the sources where you'll find a copy of ST *Writer* is The South West Library. ■

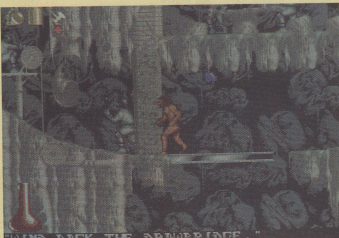

HERE COME THE GAMES

Every game manufacturer worth mentioning will be in Kensington next week for the event of the year – the Computer Entertainment Show.

Enjoy! That's the watchword for the Computer Entertainment Show (CES) to be held at Kensington Olympia, running from September 13 to 16. Although the first two days are trade only, the weekend will see new games, hardware, competitions, and special offers for the general public.

Unlike many previous computer shows, CES is geared towards leisure. That means that consoles will do battle with hand-helds, which in turn will face-off Amigas. While the trade angle represents long hours of lunch, dinner and post-prandial drinks in which deals will be made, the public days will offer coin-ops, demos, prizes, new games to see and play.

In order for you to plan your trip to what looks like being one of the biggest events to hit the computer world in years, *Express* is providing an exhibitor-by-exhibitor guide to all that's best.

NINTENDO (STAND E50)

Nintendo is out for blood this Christmas. Already a big player in the global console market, CES will see it

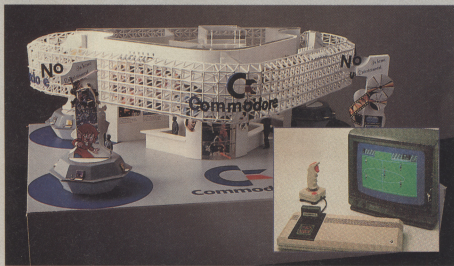
flexing its corporate muscles in the UK. First up, and riding the crest of the *Teenage Mutant Hero Turtle* wave, Nintendo will have its *Mutant Machine* on show. The package comprises the Nintendo Entertainment Centre and a copy of the platform, 'pizza-em-up', turtle game. With a vast range of games ready to come out, Nintendo will probably be putting on quite a show in order to make its presence felt by the likes of Amstrad, Sega, Commodore and Atari.

MINDSCAPE (STAND B15)

Mindscape has Tom Cruise to offer. *Days of Thunder*, the game of the Cruise's new *Top Gun*-with-cars movie, will be showing. Along with this will be; *Wing Commander*, new out for the PC; *Ultimate Ride*, by Chris Grey of *Superbike* fame, on all major formats; and *Savage Empire* which makes use of characters from *Ultima VI*.

If that wasn't enough there will also be *4D Boxing* and *4D Sports Driving*; and there's *Track on 2*, an air traffic control simulation which can be linked to, as yet

With both CDTV and the C64 console up its sleeve, the question is what to show first? Commodore has planned for the latter. CDTV will get a brief trade showing on the first day of the show with more software (or is a

compact disc actually hardware?) promised, but the public will not get to see it. However, the main thrust of Commodore's CES strategy will be the Amiga and the C64s. Another Amiga educational bundle is in the

pipeline, and the C64 will be looking at more releases. The Commodore stand is also a sight to behold – a space-age structure with a vast amount of floor space to hold the numerous playable machines.

AMSTRAD (STAND F18)

It might be worth your while to keep an eye on stand F18. Amstrad is coming to CES on the back of the new Plus range of computers and consoles. The CPC 464 and 6128 Pluses will both be on show, as will the GX4000 console.

Amstrad's stand will be one of the biggest it has yet taken on the road, with some 50 playable machines available. Cagney as normal about what it will or won't be showing, it is expected that new games will be previewed for the new machines. We do know that several games houses are currently developing software for the console – which presently only has two games in the form of the free *Burnin' Rubber* and *Fire and Forget* from Titus, so CES would be the ideal place to really put the GX4000 through its paces with some new cartridges.

unnamed, flight sims. As yet no console action has been finalised.

ZEPPELIN

Zeppelin will be hitting CES with new games and two new labels. Zeppelin Platinum 16-Bit will be releasing £9.99 games in quality packaging. The mother company feels that the price is right and is hoping for companies such as Ocean to follow. On top of this the Cognito label has been dropped, to be replaced by Impulse.

Games at the show will be: *Blinky Scary* School, *World Soccer* and *Jackie Wilson's Darts Challenge*. There are also two BBC TV games ready for the off, one of which is a highly prized Aussie title.

Like most of the other software houses exhibiting, no console releases have been finalised.

AUDIOGENIC (STAND E16)

Arcade action with *Audiogenic Exterminator*, its first coin-op conversion for the ST and Amiga, will be on view in both home computer and arcade machine forms. It will also be giving a British showing to its first puzzle game for Nintendo, called *Loops*. The game will not be on sale in the UK for some time, so it might be an idea to give it a look while you can. Aside from these, there will also be a *Bubble-Bubble-ish* game called *Helter Skelter*, and *Arcade Quiz* (not sports-based we were told). No console news as yet, but plans are afoot and *Audiogenic* is looking for a deal with Amstrad, so keep your eyes open.

MICROPROSE (F22)

MicroProse took great pride in telling us about the huge stand it is planning to have, and the number of attractions it will weigh that self-same stand down with.

Along with playable demos will be large-screen videos of new games such as *Rick Dangerous II*. The company will show arcade versions of many of the games which will be on free play, although tokens will be issued to give everyone at least one crack of the whip. This means that games like *F19*, *Betrayal*, and *MI Tank Platoon* will probably be played to death. While

WHY, WHERE AND WHEN?

The Computer Entertainment Show will, it is hoped, be one of the biggest computer trade meetings of the year. Business will be done, deals made, and games played.

The venue is Kensington Olympia in London. Although CES runs from September 13 to 16, the first two days will be for trade meetings. Members of the public should get their walking shoes on – and from the size of the venue and the number of exhibitors, they will need to be sturdy shoes at that – ready for the last two days. Gates open at 10am and close at 6pm. By the way, a portion of the entrance fee will go to the Childline Charity.

How to get there: Kensington Olympia tube station will open during the show; change at Earl's Court (on the District and Piccadilly lines). If you're driving, then think twice. Unless you've managed to reserve a parking place – very difficult – you will find parking to be a problem. Three bus services are also available from Earl's Court: 74, 31, and 30. British Rail also runs services to Kensington Olympia station. These will be synchronised with InterCity trains from the north-west and south-east of England.

It is expected that hotel accommodation will be rarer than a dodo in hunting season, especially near the show itself.

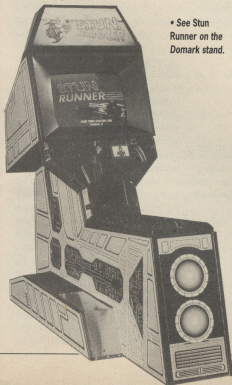
members of the public are playing the games, the trade crews will be wined and dined in the hospitality suite.

DOMARK (STAND F12)

Domark appears to have pulled out all the stops for CES 1990, but then again it normally does. The stand is futuristic, with a doomy post-holocaust feel. Games to look out for will be: Tengen's *Stun Runner* (there will be two *Stun Runner* arcade games on the stand for comparison), *Badlands*, *Thunder Jaws*, *Hydra*, *Skull and Crossbones* and an old favourite in the guise of *Hard Drivin'*.

James Bond is also there with *The Spy Who Loved Me*. Frankly there will be more games software than the average player could get through in a year. *Badlands* from Tengen will also be there, a follow-up to *Super Sprint*, it features sprint racing on a nuclear background. You are armed and dangerous. Once you've stopped playing the games, there will also be a shop for T-shirts, badges and, of course, the software.

CENTRESOFT (STAND F14)

Not well known to the public, Centresoft is one of the biggest distributors in the computer world. Due to Atari's absence from the show, the Centresoft stand will be the only place to see the Lynx and Gameboy hand-helds in all their glory. Centresoft are also distributing the Sega Megadrive, and the Nintendo Entertainment Centre. If you can get it in, it will be a treat.

ELECTRONIC ARTS

Electronic Arts is intending to blast the competition at CES. The company is very 'up' and will be showing some 13 new(sh) pieces of software. *Battle Chess II* will be there for the warped strategy warriors among you. *Magic Fly*, *Lord of the Rings*, *Chuck Yeager*, *Stormovik* and *Powermonger* are just a few of the names to be seen and played. Console owners, those of the Megadrive variety anyway, should be aware that both *Populous* and *Budokan* will be on view at the show.

GREMLIN (STAND H6)

Gremlin has had a good computer year so far, and now it has plans for the console market. At CES there will be plenty of playable demos, new releases and general good times to be had at the Gremlin stand. Look out for *DHSS Jane Seymour* and the free copies of *FOFT (Federation of Free Traders)* which are being packaged with it. Also there will be *Lotus Turbo Esprit Challenge* and *Team Suzuki* to watch and play.

OCEAN (STAND H4)

The Ocean stand is always worth a look at any show, and CES is no different. It will be previewing a number of its Christmas goodies, including cartridges for the C64 and Amstrad GX4000 consoles – *RoboCop II* for the Amstrad will be one to watch out for. The wealth of goodies from Ocean should make its stand difficult to get onto, but rewarding once you have. Be prepared for surprises, new releases and demos.

ACCOLADE (STAND D16)

Accolade also has plenty to offer. With an excellent golf sim out this year, in the form of *Jack Nicklaus Unlimited Golf*, plenty more is to be expected. A new puzzle game called *Ishido*, looks simple – plays like a bitch, will be on show. The Accolade Graphics Engine will also be there to see, two games *Search for the King* and *Altered Destiny* make use of this. Finally, dear old *Elvira of HorrorSoft* fame will probably be flying around, so a wander over to the Accolade stand could pay dividends.

PSYGNOSIS

Psygnosis has other things up its corporate sleeve than *Shadow of the Beast II*. CES will see several new releases from the company; watch out for *Nitro*, a high-speed car racing game featuring night driving.

A game with the intriguing name of *The Killing Game Show* is also due to be shown at CES. It features arcade quality platform action. You have to escape from a vertical maze against a set time limit. An interesting element of the game is the action replay; not only does this allow you to watch your mistakes over the difficult sections, you can also drop back into the game during the replay.

For the less energetic amongst you, Psygnosis is also showing *Pugsy*, a cutesie game featuring cartoon-like characters, some of whom are clad in Shaggy-like (or Happy Monday-like if you prefer) flared jeans; like zoinks!

Psygnosis have not confirmed any console software launches at the show but you never know, but keep your eyes peeled for *Shadow of the Beast* on the C64.

Just when you thought it was safe to wander about Olympia. Yes, the staff of *New Computer Express* will be on the stand, ready to talk to you. If that's not good enough, representatives from our sister magazines *Amiga Format*, *ST Format*, *Commodore Format*, *S, Your Sinclair* and *Amstrad Action* will also be available for close questioning, brickbats and the occasional small goblet of praise. There may even be the odd freebie.

It's not so much that I object to the ridiculousness of your recommendation, but more that I cannot understand how you can justify making such bald statements as: "There's no contest at all. The Amiga wins by a long head."

Although I suspect that you are just another knee-jerk Amigaphile, I look forward to your explaining to us all how a computer designed for games playing and graphics, with a notoriously slow disk handling system, a legendary propensity to crash at the most inopportune time, two hardware kludges in the form of Midi port and TV modulator, together with a selection of software that was never written to complement other features, could possibly compete on this issue with a machine bundle that has none of these failings and yet which also boasts an extra £12K of memory!

What was it you called me? Does this mean that although you're a self-styled computer expert, no-one ever took the trouble to teach you the rudiments of etiquette or manners.

What a shame that someone who demands reason and well-balanced argument should be incapable of the basics that are taught to young children. I stand by what I said. There is no doubt at all in my mind, the Amiga is superior to the ST. This doesn't mean that the ST has anything wrong with it, nor does it

If you truly believe that the ST is a better machine, you are not a full shilling. Had you suggested that a colour Mac or an Archimedes was a better piece of kit, I might have agreed, but the ST? Nice computer, but not in the same league as the others.

I would like to contribute some additional information to two of your Tech Tips printed in Express 93.

• Z88 to Amiga (2000) file transfer (part of "Wacking WACCI" - A Dale of Nottingham)

The Music Suite of Newcastle Emlyn, Dyfed (0239 710594), produces an excellent utility called Z88-Amiga Link which not only supports file transfer both ways, but also allows files to be sent directly to the Amiga's printer. Transferred files can be saved to Amiga disk in Z88 format for

subsequent up-loading, or imported into a WP program for further enhancement. All for around £20 - very good value. The Music Suite can supply the necessary Z88 serial cable if required, and also offers similar programs for Z88-to-PC and Z88-to-ST.

• Amiga quality output ("DTP Amiga" - A McCreddie, Glasgow)

Given Mr McCreddie's £1,000 (thank you very much), my choice would be (in fact, was) a Hewlett Packard DeskJet Plus printer at £600 and Pagestream DTP software at £130. The DeskJet produces 300 x 300 dpi, the same as most lasers, but is considerably cheaper to run and is fully supported by the much underrated Pagestream. The original Pagestream (V1.6 and below) was spoilt by some nasty bugs and could be crashed predictably. The bad name it thus gained is a great pity because it is an extremely powerful program with features not available on more expensive rivals (try rotating text in Professional Page). The recent V1.8 has fixed the bugs (I haven't managed to crash it yet) and added some features (much faster printing, etc.) and was mailed to me from the US absolutely free! (Note for fellow Pagestream fan (I think) Jason Holborn: SDL didn't have any knowledge of V2.0 (your Amiga column in Express 89 p8) when I phoned them today, and the wonderful Digipro of Southampton seem to have sunk without trace.)

I'm happy for my address to be passed on to the above tipsters if they want more information.

■TIP! Archie solution

I have been reading about Bertrum Carro's attempts to improve the text-file viewing facility over the last couple of weeks, and have come up with a partial solution which, although a bit complicated to set up initially, works without having to run any programs before viewing the file.

In order to use this solution, you will need a copy of *FromED*, the window editing program from Acorn, and you must configure your Arc to boot from (preferably) a hard disk, or a floppy on startup. In the top directory of the boot disk, create a directory called 'Templates', and in the 'Iboot file add the line 'Set WimpPath .:' (or whichever drive you use). This instructs the Arc to look through all its templates for windows such as error messages, directory viewers etc in your new directory, rather than in RAM, and so

allows you, using *FormED*, to alter the definitions of these windows. So how do you get to them?

Deep in the bowels of the Arc, there is a filing system called 'DeskFS'. This filing system cannot, to my knowledge, be accessed from the desktop, and allows only very limited file operations. Enter this filing system by typing "DeskFS" at the OS prompt. A catalogue reveals 5 files, each of which contains the templates for windows required by one 'chunk' of the operating system. The one we are interested in is 'Templates.Wimp', but all the files must be copied. DeskFS doesn't allow multiple file copies, so copy each file individually into your own new 'Templates' directory.

Now, to change the windows, all you need to do is load *FormED*, and drop one of the templates files into it. Do this with the 'Wimp' file. You will see a window with a yellow title bar, titled "commands" - this is the window used for displaying text files. Raise this window to the top, and bring up the menu over it. Go through the 'window flags' option, and select 'H scroll'. This gives the window a scroll bar and resize icon. Move the window right to the far left of the screen, and resize it to the full width of the screen. I also find it useful to make it slightly deeper, so I can see more of the file at once. Finally, remove

the scroll bar and save the template file. Now re-boot your Arc, and double-click on a text file - 80 columns (79?) at last!

Using this method you can really customise the desktop - you can even give the icon bar a title bar, and make it movable! Or how about directory windows in tasteful green and yellow? The possibilities are endless.

This doesn't solve the problem of text files flying past your eyes, but at least you can use the full width of the screen, and a deeper window gives more time to reach [Ctrl] or scroll lock.

AMIGA 3000: THE NEXT GENERATION

With the Amiga 3000 Commodore has moved into the fast lane with a 68030 processor and megabytes of memory. Keith Pomfret took a look at the exciting machine and the new version of Workbench.

There may be more Amigas in the future but the Amiga 3000 looks like the top of the Amiga evolutionary tree. Anything new will branch sideways, not up. A year's hype, a lot of promises and a good deal of conjecture finally revealed three machines bearing the Amiga 3000 badge. The cheapest of Commodore's serious workstation beaters will set you back £2,875, but more of prices and specifications later.

When you take your shiny new Amiga 3000 out of the box, you could be forgiven for thinking that you'd got a PC by mistake. The small footprint, sturdy metal casing and business-like appearance are reminiscent of the current generation of power PCs.

Head on the fluted styling is broken up only by a pair of indicator lights for power and drive, the solitary 3.5-inch disk drive and a chunky 'Leggo' button on the right-hand side that powers the Amiga up.

The keyboard is revised and feels more solid than its predecessor on the B2000. On the right hand side of the case are the mouse/joystick/pointer controls at desk level and the mouse provided is the chunky Amiga one that we all know and modify. The mouse looks the same as all Amiga mice have done but is one of the current generation with proper switches instead of soulless clickers.

Around at the back of the machine there are plenty of holes, sockets and connectors to allow a plethora of hang-'em-offs.

As well as the more usual serial port, parallel port and RGB connector there's a SCSI port for more hard drives, a floppy drive connector, video out and mode selector and a pair of stereo jack plugs to carry the sound to an external amplifier or monitor.

The two video outputs mean that as well as running the standard Amiga monitors (or even a TV set via the modulator if you're a total cheapskate), a high resolution VGA PC monitor can be connected. At the highest resolution supported by the new machine, a VGA monitor becomes essential.

On the software side of things you get Workbench 2, ARexx and AVision. Workbench 2 is the package that we all thought would be Workbench 1.4 with a few extra tweaks. ARexx is a user friendly programming language designed to take the pain out of the CLI and AVision is a multimedia development environment that controls the whole multimedia chain rather like a super-intelligent octopus with many hands to drive many different media simultaneously.

CHOICE OF THREE

There are three models wearing the Amiga 3000 badge. For £2,875, you get the slower (16MHz) 3000 with a 68030 processor, 40Mb hard disk drive and the chunky 68881 maths co-processor.

If your wallet stretches to £3,450, you can have a 25MHz 68030 machine with the 68882 co-processor

and the same 40Mb storage. The real cashflow crusher is the top of the range £3,800 model which mirrors the middle one in all but its 100Mb hard drive.

Three useful machines but the clever machine is betting that the middle one will pull the most sales.

On power up, the quiet(ish) fan and the quick hard drives vie for which make the most noise, and the drives win by a short decibel. There's enough noise to know that the machines are on but not the turbine in a railway tunnel symphony of white noise so indicative of PCs (especially Amstrads).

DISPLAY

As well as the current Amiga displays, there are two new ones: a four colour from 256, 1,280 x 400 mode and a 16 colour from 4,096, 640 by 480 mode. Those in themselves wouldn't be special but the fact that they don't have to interlace to do it should raise a couple of eyebrows. This high-resolution non-interlace mode means that a VGA PC monitor is needed, hence the 15-pin PC-style connector on the back.

In order to display the new VGA modes and the old Amiga screen modes, you'll need either a couple of ▶

AVISION

AVision is the interface that can make the Amiga 3000 a powerful multimedia driver. Controlling all inputs and outputs it utilises the multi-tasking power of the Amiga to keep the various audio, video, and digital aspects of multimedia in synchronisation.

Only just released to developers, AVision is too big a subject to cover in a short review so watch Express for the full AVision story soon.

INSIDE THE AMIGA 3000

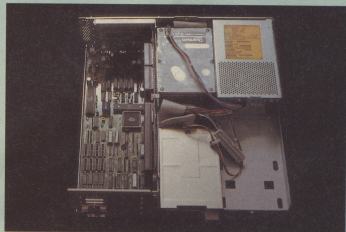
It's a busy scene under the bonnet of the 3000. Its trendy small footprint means that there's less space inside. Hard drive and controller, power supply, fan and floppy take almost two thirds of the space above the motherboard. The remaining third is an open cage for expansion cards.

As the new display has cured the problem that needed the flicker fixing card and the hard disk controller is mounted separately, this means that the four slots are free for any other use. The small space in the expansion card cage means that the cards must be mounted horizontally. PCs that have been manufactured this way have sometimes experienced slight heat problems with the lack of the 'chimney' effect. Expansion cards standing vertically are better able to

lose their heat by convection than horizontal ones which trap the heat.

Of the four slots, one is Amiga dedicated, two are PC format for use with the PC Bridgeboard and one is dedicated to video and display handling.

Anyone who gets the same destructive pleasure that techno-journalists get from disemboweling everything electronic in sight will feel a great let-down from the Amiga 3000. Everything slides simply in and out and there's practically no skill at all needed to reduce the machine to a pile of components. This will be useful for those wishing to add internal upgrades and the third party add-ons that will surely follow this machine as quickly as alloy wheels follow a new sports coupe.

monitors or a multi-sync monitor of the type that can display both 15 and 31kHz modes.

Display in the Amiga has always hitherto been handled by the dedicated display chip Denise, but in the 3000 Denise has whisked through puberty and blossomed into a regular little lady, offering better resolution and more elegant screen handling modes.

COMPATIBILITY

Programs for the 500 and 2000 that follow the rules and don't do silly things like tweaking the copper should run OK, but there may be some problems caused by the self-modifying code used as protection in games software. As Commodore sees the machine as a serious workstation, it doesn't see this as a problem but who's to say that serious workstationers don't like to play the occasional game?

There may be some instances where a program (probably a game) will be compatible with the internals of the 3000 and yet get tripped up by the first few bytes of protection on the disk.

MEMORY

The new machine comes with 2Mb of RAM on board and the new architecture means that it can now access 2Mb of chip RAM and up to 16 megabytes of fast RAM. Chip RAM is the memory that can be accessed by the 'blitter' and it has steadily grown in size from the 256K

AREXX

ARExx gives CLI the clout to transform the simple command line into a powerful utility. Although ARExx is a programming language, it reacts directly with the CLI to take it beyond batch routines to allow complete sequences of events to be set to run automatically. Rather than being a language of implementation, it is a language of manipulation; taking available commands and stringing them into a sequence that could attach to a network, file server, or on line service, check for mail/files etc, download the necessary and logoff again. In short it's a sort of auto pilot for the CLI.

in prototype machines via 512K to one megabyte and now two.

All this may sound spacious but the bare machine comes with only two megabytes of memory split evenly between chip RAM and fast RAM. Extra RAM chips can be added as and when required.

There's much chatter about using fast disk drives in the same way as memory. The current generation of drives are reducing access times to a few milliseconds, so this technique - known as 'virtual memory' - is possible.

Overall, workstation buyers will no doubt cast a second glance at the new Amiga 3000. ■

LIMITATIONS

The dedicated graphics and sound chip set that has made the Amiga so powerful since its inception is limiting its speed now.

Back in the mid 80s, the 7.16MHz chip set speed was racy but even the current enhancements and improvements in the 3000 can't improve on the original speed - the dedicated chips still run at 7MHz.

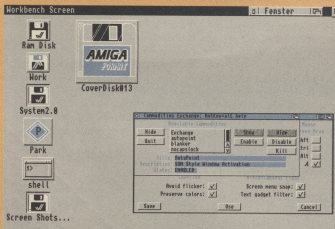
To get the dedicated chips into the 90s will need a complete re-write and re-modeling that will bring with it a new computer.

With the custom chips the 16MHz 68030-based machine performs only about 15 per cent faster than the ordinary 68000 Amigas, although with the math co-processor it can number crunch at a fair lick. The 25MHz machines will obviously outshine the cheaper one, but are still not that impressive.

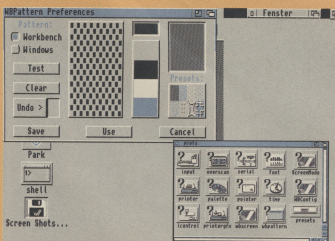
The logical upgrade for Commodore would be to a machine based on the Motorola Reduced Instruction Set Computer (RISC) chip, the 88000, and this could mean an exciting new machine.

It has been suggested that the 68040 might be the next step, but why put a V12 in an old Cortina if you've got the technology and the money to design a new sports car?

THE NEW WORKBENCH

Blue, orange, white and black have (thankfully) been dragged to the dustbin icon and trashed. In their place is a gentler grey, blue, white and black. The effect is more soothing and to make life easier, there's a pull down bar of pre-set Workbench colours with several pastel combinations to choose from.

Colours can still be tweaked and sorted in the traditional way but we couldn't find a more pleasing combination than the presets. On a mono monitor (if anyone owning an Amiga 3000 is poor enough to only have mono) the preset Workbench colours merge into a blur so a contrast enhancing adjustment is needed to make the display readable. Workbench looked OK then on amber and green monitors but shone on a paper white display.

A disk of existing software was loaded into Workbench 2 and whoops... the new colours and the old icons look like something from Picasso on a bad day.

A simple enhancement in Workbench 2 is the ability to enter CLI commands and syntax in single lines or steps, instead of having to roll up sleeves and attack the command line with gusto.

Error messages are simpler to understand, giving some written clue to the problem instead of a faceless number that needed to be looked up in a table. File handling is improved as well. You no longer have to play the Russian doll game of opening several boxes to find a smaller one inside.

Workbench 2 allows simpler chasing around directories and access at any level of the directory chain.

Someone with an Apple Macintosh has had a hand in the development of Workbench 2 and this shows in the Select

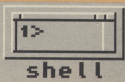
All feature. A box is opened around the offending icons on an untidy Workbench and all the icons can be shifted and sorted together. Also from the Macintosh is the View by Name feature. This dumps icons in favour of the much simplified text equivalent.

One slight problem is the increased font control. Sure it's nice to replace the dreadful Topaz font with something like Helvetica or Times Roman but the different point sizes and spacing can leave you with menu bars that can't fit all of the text. It's a good idea to take size into account if using these facilities and remember that proportionally spaced text will spread differently.

Preferences looks nicer now and as well as a more useful and simpler to use screen. It combines some of the old routines which means a job such as installing a printer can be easier.

The startup sequence benefits from the changes as well. There's a simple drop-in-the-box routine that allows you to select what is implemented at start up by dumping the desired progs into a startup drawer. No more getting the hands dirty on the messy old Ed.

So there it is, the Workbench that we should have had a year ago. The good news is that it is claimed to run on lesser Amigas. The bad news is that some of the features rely on the enhanced ROM set of the 3000 so they won't be available. Still, it's a lovely environment on any machine.

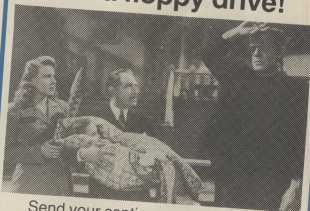

GAME REVIEW

PC GOLF

The golf game seems to have taken over from the flight simulator as the office leisure software of the moment. Take a trip around a PC-based office and you'll find space bars being avidly tapped by on-screen golfers all over the building.

World Class Leader Board was the first, and for a long time the best, PC golf game but 1990 has seen a crop of new hopefuls enter the arena.

First up was *Greg Norman's Shark Attack*. Offering every option imaginable over the swing and addressing of the ball, this game was let down by some truly dreadful graphics in the PC version.

Then came *PGA Tour Golf*. The office PC was used for little else for weeks - *PGA Tour* is instantly playable but takes a long time to master, and its graphics are excellent. When you hit a drive the viewing angle changes to a from-the-flag view half way through, and each hole is preceded by an animated helicopter fly-by. *PGA Tour* looked at golf through the eyes of an arm-

chair Faldo watcher rather than an experienced player, and benefited hugely from it.

Now joining the fray comes the hugely expensive (£40) *Jack Nicklaus Unlimited Golf*. Jack is not strictly a new player - his *18 Greatest Holes of Championship Golf* has been out for some time - but *Unlimited Golf* has been improved in so many ways that it deserves to be treated as a new game.

IN PLAY

There is nothing vastly innovative about the game play of *Unlimited Golf*. The ball is struck by tapping three times on the spacebar, the timing of the taps determining the power and accuracy. You can aim and choose different clubs using either the keyboard or a mouse.

The game has borrowed some of *PGA Tour's* best features; the action replay for instance, and you can choose to view the shot from the pin. The slope of green is shown with a contour map which is superimposed on the playing surface. This is better than *PGA Tour's* separate screen, and the angled way the player

stands to the hole makes putting difficult and challenging. There is no such thing as a simple putt, and that means that you have to keep up the concentration throughout.

Weather conditions are variable, and this changes factors such as the speed of the greens. Two courses are provided; Muirfield and an imaginary course.

Overall there is nothing very new about the game itself, but it plays solidly and you feel that if you hit a bad shot it was your mistake rather than the program's - which can't be said of all its rivals. There is, however, one thing which sets *Unlimited Golf* apart and gives it its name - the fact that you can design your own courses.

COURSE DESIGNER

The course design program which comes with *Unlimited Golf* is superb. It offers complete and total control over the course; you can alter hills and valleys of the course (*Unlimited Golf* features sloping fairways), add water and trees and even paint your own backdrop. Every aspect of the courses which are provided can be

altered, so you can create a perfect customised course.

In use it is rather like a paint package, and, although it can be controlled from the keyboard, a mouse is essential to maintain your sanity. After the initial fun of making a totally impossible course (a 310-yard par three over a lake anyone?) you soon settle down into trying to hit the right level of difficulty.

It takes a lot of time and effort to produce a decent course; you have to play the course while taking notes and then go back and edit it to do it properly. To help you along the manual gives a lot of hints, and Jack himself pops up from time to time with advice.

The course designer makes *Unlimited Golf* the most interesting golf game, although the gameplay itself falls a fraction short of *PGA Tour*. In tandem with the ability to make your own courses, Jack Nicklaus is on to a winner. ■

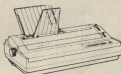

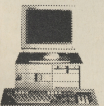

Straightforward un-authorised access to a computer system can lead to a significant fine and/or up to six months imprisonment and seizure of the offender's equipment.

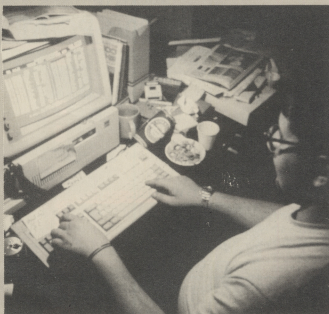

The writer says that there aren't any cases of ST software being better than the Amiga's. I'm not saying the ST is better than the Amiga, but each has its specialist field. I haven't heard many Amiga owners who haven't commented that the ST's serious software is in many cases much more usable. The owner of a local Amiga PD service said exactly that. GFA BASIC 3 was eagerly awaited on the Amiga, but it just can't match the ST version.

So why let this Comment column go to print? It isn't that the ST scene is slowing down, it's just that companies can't afford to produce rubbish anymore. A 'rough head count' of incoming software isn't the point. How good is the software you're counting? Last year has seen the introduction of *Script, Harlekin, Protekt* and the excellent *Calamus*. While the ST is

big in Germany it certainly won't run out of excellent software.

The author of Comment replies: I did not say that there are no cases of ST software being better than Amiga software; I did say that the old days of the ST outclassing the Amiga on the serious software side have gone.

This is undoubtedly the case – there is now plenty of excellent Amiga software for word processing, DTP, music, you name it. The point I was making was that there is no need to make an Amiga emulate an ST.

As for the German software, it's true that a lot of good stuff is coming from that country, but as an ST owner myself I feel less than confident knowing that most decent software is coming from abroad, where a tiny change in exchange rates could make translating the program into English unviable. It's not healthy to rely on imports this much.

Also, I'm afraid two of the four programs you mention as being released in the last year are in fact older than that.

I would, of course, love to be proved wrong and I'm looking forward to the flood of top-notch ST software which is at this moment being piled into sacks at Bath Sorting Office. ■

■ Smacked wrists over an Amiga board

In your edition of 18 August 1990, under the 'Your format – Amiga' section, Jason

Holborn reported on the ATonce PC emulator board under the heading 'AT Power for 200'.

His report is riddled with misinformation and errors and as such could be misleading to the readers of your publication.

Firstly, he states that the ATonce board is sub-£200. As at this date the board is not available and even if it comes on to the market with the scheduled date of October I guess that it will be at the same price as the ST version i.e. £199. This is indeed sub-£200 – just.

Assuming this to be the case, Bitcon's Power PC board is not £200 more expensive – it is £324, making it £125 more expensive. Nowhere near the £200 so blatantly claimed.

He later reasserts his claim that Bitcon's board is £400.

He then states that the ATonce board is all under development, so how can he make factual statements as to its capabilities? He should

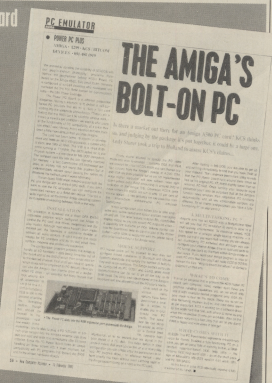
have said something like "...it is claimed that the board will be capable of...".

Has he personally fully tested both boards in their finished form? No he hasn't!

Has he read the press regarding Windows 3, which it seems is a major advance for the Amiga to be running. The general opinion in the PC press is that Windows 3 is not that good.

What is the advantage of multi-tasking Amiga and PC software? Maybe he would like to explain, as mostly the two are totally incompatible and I for one can see no earthly reason for so doing, except as a demo of the machines capability. Not a lot of use!

Finally, if the ATonce is going to be available for October at the assumed price, should he not point out that fitting it requires considerably more skill and invalidated the warranty, unlike the Bitcon board that can be fitted in minutes without loss of warranty and performs totally adequately in PC mode. (I have been using one for over a month now with absolutely no problems).
